



2013 Typhoon Haiyan (WFP Logistics)

In order to facilitate immediate deployment of the support equipment for the start-up of the operations and other humanitarian relief items, this Special Operation makes provision for strategic airlifts from the United Nations Humanitarian Response Depot network to the main staging area inside the Philippines, Cebu.

2014 Myanmar Underfunded (Health Cluster)

Provide routine immunisation according to national schedule to all children and pregnant women

2013 Zamboanga Conflict (IOM CCCM)

Ensure deployment of camp management support staff to all IDP sites or evacuation centres, registration for Disaster Assistance Family Access Card (DAFAC), and rollout of the Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM)

2014 Solomon Islands Floods (OHCHR Protection)

Support to humanitarian response through promoting and protection human rights; in order to ensure the overall humanitarian response adheres to fundamental life-saving protection principles, due to the gap of protection presence in the Solomon Islands.
