

WFP Logistics

In order to facilitate immediate deployment of the support equipment for the start-up of the operations and other humanitarian relief items, this Special Operation makes provision for **strategic airlifts from the United Nations Humanitarian Response Depot network to the main staging area inside the Philippines.**

## 2013 Sudan Floods

UNICEF Education

**Emergency repair of 120 flood-damaged classrooms –**

Repair to damaged walls, roofing, flooring, windows and doors to reach at least 5,400 students

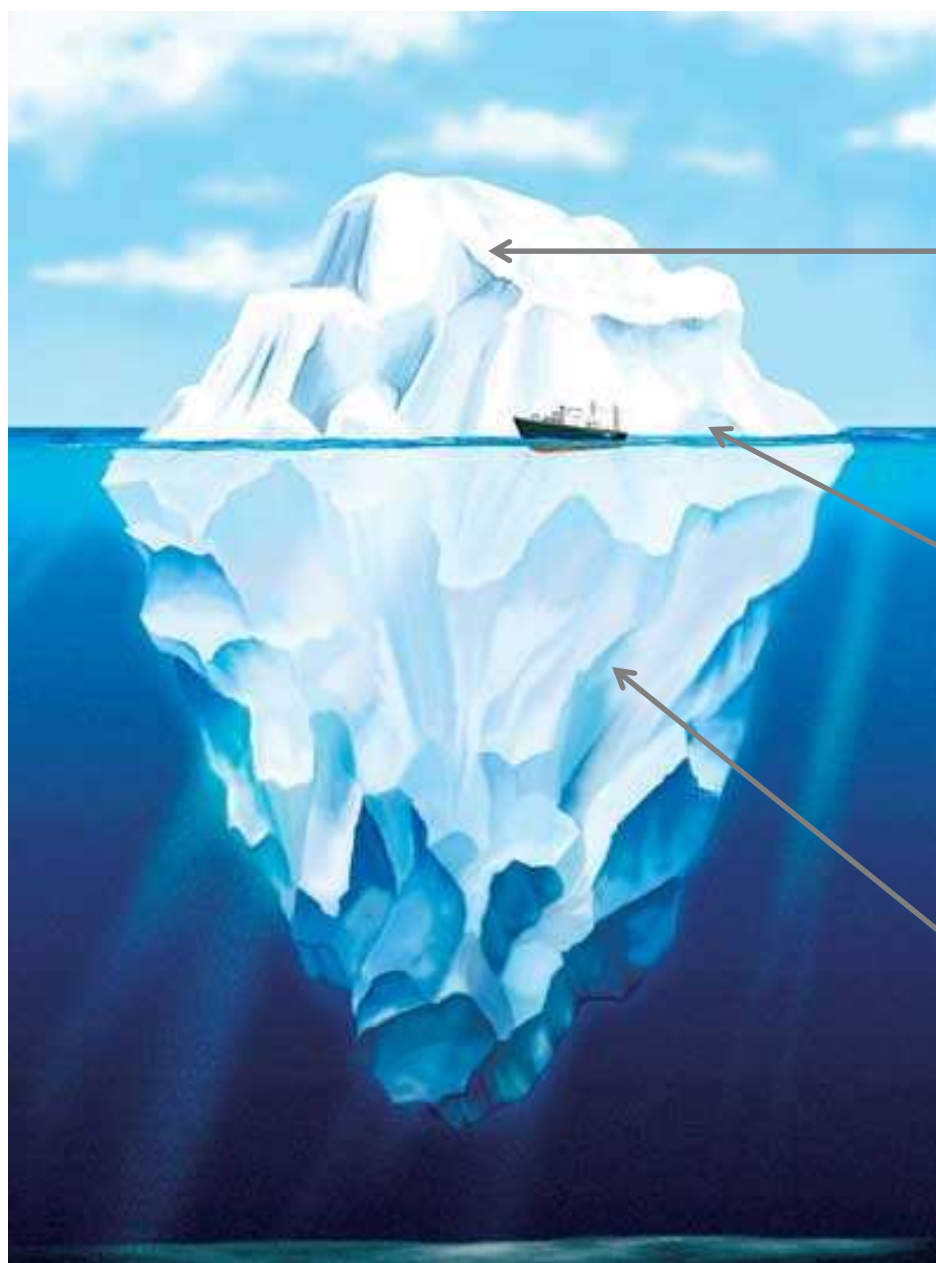
